Wins Scholarship At Hebrew U.

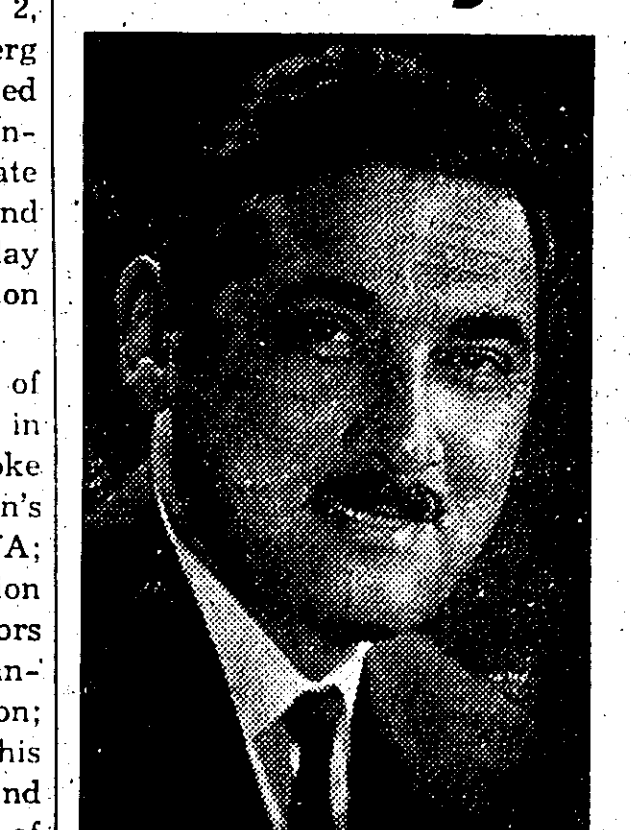
Ambassador to Edmonton for UJA

Arnold to Tour Western Region



A. J. Arnold, executive director for the western region of Canadian Jewish Congress, will make his first tour of Jewish communities in Saskatchewan and Alberta from May 8 to 20. He will report on activities by Canadian Jewish Congress at the national level as well as in the western region.

In particular, he will report on the initiative taken by Congress to obtain amendments to the Canadian Criminal Code that would make it a crime to advocate genocide — the slaughter of whole groups of people such as was carried out by the nazis in World War II. This legislation would also outlaw the dissemination of anti-Semitic and other forms of hate literature.

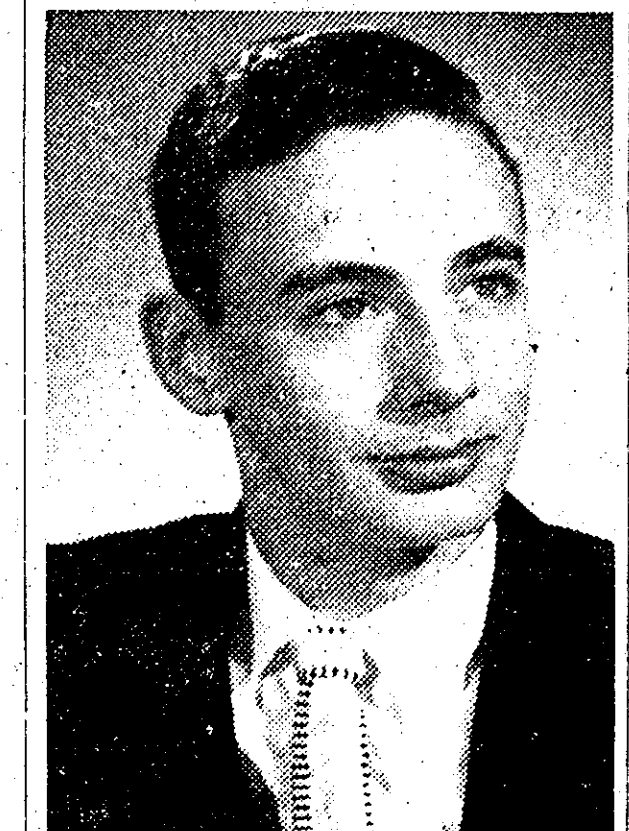
The tour will begin Sunday, May 8, in Moose Jaw; Tuesday, May 10, in Medicine Hat; Wednesday, May 11, in Lethbridge, and Thursday and Friday, May 12 and 13, in Calgary. During the second week he will visit Edmonton, Saskatoon, Prince Albert and Melfort.

Before becoming executive director of Congress, Mr. Arnold served as public relations director for the Federation of Jewish Community Services in Montreal, following a 12-year stint as editor and publisher of the Jewish Western Bulletin in Vancouver.

University to Honor Hirsch

John Hirsch, a Bachelor of Arts graduate from the University of Manitoba in 1952, whose work as director of the Manitoba Theatre Centre has raised the standard of theatre productions in this province to a high level, will receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Letters, at the 87th annual Spring Convocation on May 26. Mr. Hirsch came to Canada from a European refugee centre in 1947. Five years later he was graduated with a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Manitoba with highest marks for his year in English, a teaching fellowship in English and a prize for the best poem submitted in a contest. He joined the Winnipeg Little Theatre soon after arriving here and in 1952 helped form a puppet theatre, for which he designed and worked with puppets besides writing plays. After teaching English at the university for a year, Mr. Hirsch became first full-time director of the Winnipeg Little Theatre. He later became a founder of Theatre 77, which eventually developed into the Manitoba Theatre Centre. He is an advisor to the Canada Council, to the National Centennial Commission and to Expo 67. He is on the executive committee of the Theatre Communications Group, an international organization concerned with community theatre movements. He recently resigned as artistic director of MTC but remains as founding artistic director.
