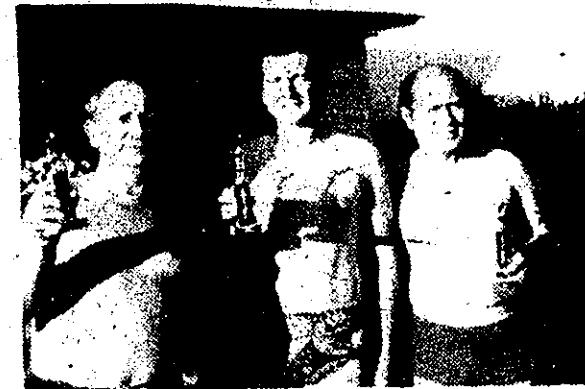

Gift to Winnipeg Associates in Aid of Scholarship Fund of Ben-Gurion U.

Winnipeg - A \$5000 contribution received recently by the Winnipeg Branch of the Canadian Associates of Ben-Gurion University in Medicine, recently established and greatly admired by the medical world.

sity of the Negev (Beersheva) will enlarge the scholarship fund of its young medical school.

The contribution was made by a non-Jewish American citizen of Montana, a grateful patient of a prominent orthopaedic surgeon, Dr. A.R. Lerner of Minneapolis, Minnesota. It was received by the president of the Winnipeg Branch of the Associates, Harry Walsh, Q.C., through Mrs. Lorraine Brownstone of Winnipeg, sister-in-law of Dr. Lerner.

The gift will be added to Dr. Diane Croll Memorial Scholarship

Dr. Croll, a prominent Winnipeg-trained physician, was well known for her work in pathology and internal medicine.

In announcing receipt of the gift, Mr. Walsh pointed out that generosity of the donor testifies to his respect for Dr. Lerner and at the same time proves how far the name of the University's medical school has travelled. The school was founded on a revolutionary concept for the training of health personnel and the delivery of health care services in the isolation of the Negev

and is closely watched and admired by the medical world.

Dean to Visit
 Professor Moshe Prywes, founding dean of the school and first president of Ben-Gurion University, will be in Winnipeg later this year at the invitation of the dean of the medical school of the University of Manitoba to participate in an international symposium on health care in general and on health care to remote areas in particular. He will familiarize the medical world with the progress made at this youngest of medical schools (inaugurated just two years ago).

Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, with campuses at Beersheva and Sdeh Boker, was chartered by the Government of Israel in 1969. Today it has a student body of over 4500, more than one third of them recent immigrants from Moslem countries. Over 600 full-time faculty members, many of them newcomers from Eastern European countries, teach and pursue research and academic work in the University's faculties of Natural, Technological, Health, Humanities and Social Sciences.

"As Israel's youngest institution of higher education," Mr. Walsh said, "the University is particularly grateful to our American donor for his generous contribution. The University needs scholarship funds for its students, largely stemming from neediest families, but intensely devoted to the realization of the Ben-Gurion dream for a flourishing, well developed and populated Negev, essential to the future and safety of Israel."

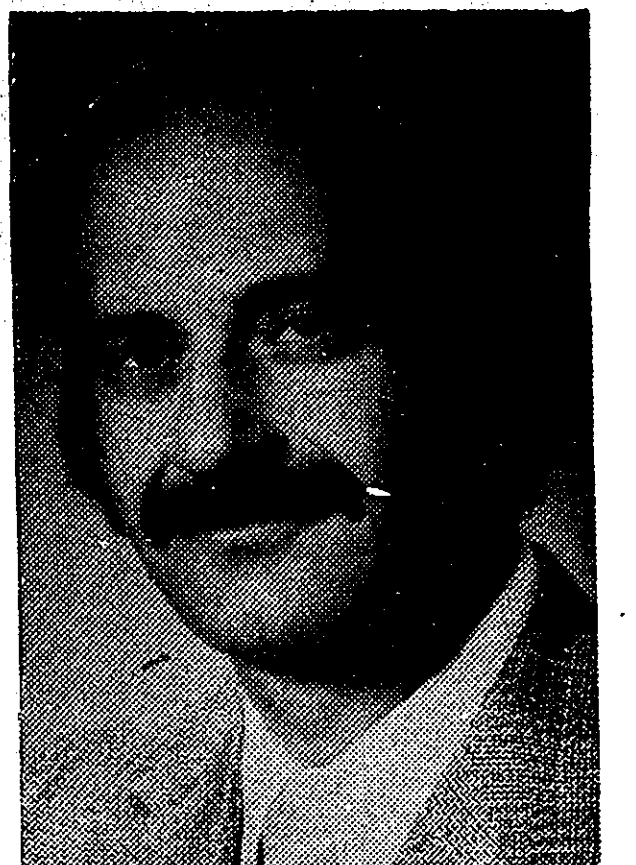
