WHO WE ARE

- To develop, interpret and disseminate information on the history and culture of Western Canadian Jewry and to develop awareness of the history, moral and ethical implications of the Holocaust and other human rights violations.
- To document, preserve and share information on the culture and historical formation of Jewish communities in Western Canada. The Centre also serves as an advocate for anti-racism and education on the Holocaust and antisemitism.
- To forge a pathway for the future by preserving and sharing compelling stories and educating the present and future generation
- To collect and preserve the records, artefacts and traditions of our community.
- To present programs and exhibits about the history, experiences, achievements, and culture of the Jewish community.
- To maintain and expand a searchable and detailed database of Jewish gravestones in Manitoba and farther afield.
- To promote the awareness and understanding of the history of the Holocaust through education—reaching thousands of students and educators each year. We address the fact that society continues to witness genocide due to continuing racism and hatred and that we must all be vigilant in opposing racism, antisemitism, and other forms of bigotry.
- Our treasured archive brings our community's history to life through its collection of images, artefacts, documents, and multimedia, including:
 - More than 70,000 photographs
 - More than 200 bound volumes of newspapers from 1914 to the present
 - Oral histories—audio, video, and text
 - 200+ linear meters of textual records
 - 100,000+ photographs
 - 1500+ sound and video recordings.
 - Original documents and artefacts from the Holocaust era

The Jewish Heritage Centre of Western Canada (JHC) brings together the Jewish Historical Society of Western Canada, the Marion & Ed Vickar Jewish Museum of Western Canada, the Jewish Historical Society Archives, the Freeman Family Foundation Holocaust Education Centre and the Manitoba Institute to Combat Antisemitism.

Message from our President & Executive Director

The Jewish Heritage Centre is dedicated to the fostering and flourishing of Jewish life in our community by providing programming and education as well as through our important work in preserving local Jewish history. We are proud of our singular role in ensuring that that history will be passed along to generations to come through our treasured archive. It gives us tremendous pride and pleasure in our collaboration with other community organizations as well as our position as the “keeper of the history” of the Jewish community.



The 2024-2025 fiscal year came with changes to the Jewish Heritage Centre Board and Staff. In January, we thanked Mark Kantor for his many years of service as our President and welcomed Harlan Abells to the position. Harlan also retains his responsibilities as Treasurer.

In a world where antisemitism, Holocaust distortion and disinformation are growing, it was important to incorporate the latest best practices which include putting the context of the Holocaust into millennia of antisemitism, as well as helping students understand who



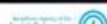
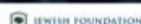

Education & Commemoration

The Jewish Heritage Centre is recognized as the principal purveyor of education on the Holocaust and on antisemitism through its Holocaust Education Centre (HEC). Each year, we provide programming, education to thousands of students and educators.

Since the October 7 attack in Israel, our community has faced an unprecedented increase in antisemitic events. The need for a mandated curriculum on Holocaust education and antisemitism, became even more important. With the announcement on Yom Hashoah 2023 of our partnership with the Province in the creation of a mandated curriculum, we continued to collaborate with the government in helping with the draft, the review, and the final execution in the autumn of 2025.

We also provided tailored presentations on antisemitism to a variety of professional groups, including medical students, teachers, and lawyers, among others.

In January, we partnered with the CMHR to present Andre Oboler, CEO of the (Australian) Online Hate Prevention Institute who presented "Hate Goes Viral."

Our virtual Holocaust and Human Rights symposium featured Holocaust survivor and author, Kitty Salsberg, interviewed by Michelle Sadowski of the Azrieli Survivor Memoirs Program. Kitty's memoir was made available to schools free of charge and we were thrilled to welcome some 5000 attendees!

In the spring, we marked Yom Hashoah in partnership with Congregation Shaarey Zedek. The reading of Megillat Hashoah– the Holocaust Scroll, with the Hon. Wab Kinew, Premier of as our lead reader as well as the participation of guest readers from a variety of faith backgrounds.

For the seventh year in a row, a student from Westwood Collegiate was the recipient of the prestigious Mina Rosner Human Rights award. Mahina Krause is a senior at Westwood Collegiate. A member of the Westwood Historical Society, she travelled with the group on the Holocaust Educational Tour of Holocaust memorial sites and camps in March of 2024. Her

experiences on the trip, learning about the dehumanization of the victims led her to write this essay which discusses how dehumanization trends have continued into the present day.

In May, we welcomed 80 Manitoba teachers to Congregation Shaarey Zedek Synagogue for a full day of professional development. We will be having two days of PD on the new curriculum in March 2026.

Genealogy Institute

Chair, Lynn Roseman, UE

This year we have continued to update our database and keep it current. We have continued reviewing the "In Memoriam" ads from the Jewish Post to ensure there is nobody left out of our files.

We continued with our photographing: all new stones added by summer's end were photographed and added to our online database (130). In addition, hyperlinks to online obituaries and other online stories are now being included in our database. It is interesting that in 2025 only about 60% of the folks who passed away had published obituaries.

Thank you again to Belle Jarniewski for translation services.

Our plans for 2026 include visiting all the Winnipeg cemeteries as usual.

Archives

Chair, Amy Karlinsky

Archivist Andrew Morrison (to April 30) Ava Garfinkel (from May 2025)

The Archives continues to serve as a significant repository for community records of all kinds, including photographs, audio visual records, letters newspapers, institutional and family records and, new this year, digital-borne records. Records or fonds are classified according to standardized search terms; finding aids are created, and these are available for researchers. The heart, soul and history of Jewish life is preserved in the archive. This material has been used by students, researchers, writers, filmmakers artists, genealogists and those seeking to consult factual data and evidence of Jewish life. The Archive supports the meticulous research for JHWC programs, newsletters and exhibitions.

This past year we said goodbye to Archivist Andrew Morrison and welcomed new archivist Ava Garfinkle. Fluent in Hebrew and English and having grown up in Manitoba with a Master's in Archeology from Tel Aviv University in Israel, Ava brings new spark and joy to the operational needs of the archive. Her specialty is in textile conservation.

All aspects of the physical plant and discrete storage mechanisms are being refined and reorganized, including the isolation room, upper conservation storage, office storage, research work areas, and the basement space where most of the objects and documents are held. Donations from the community continue to come in, and recent forays into social media have been made.

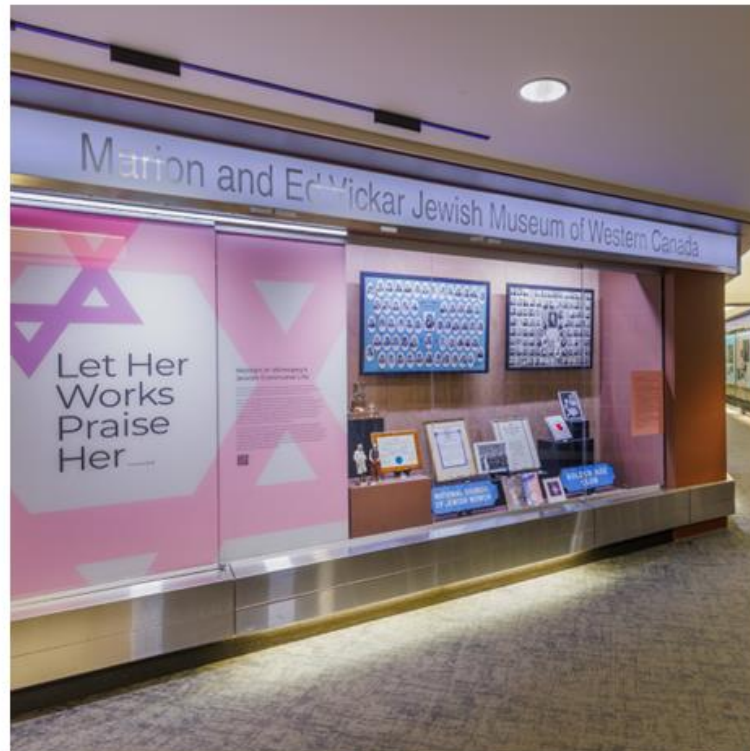
Programs & Exhibits

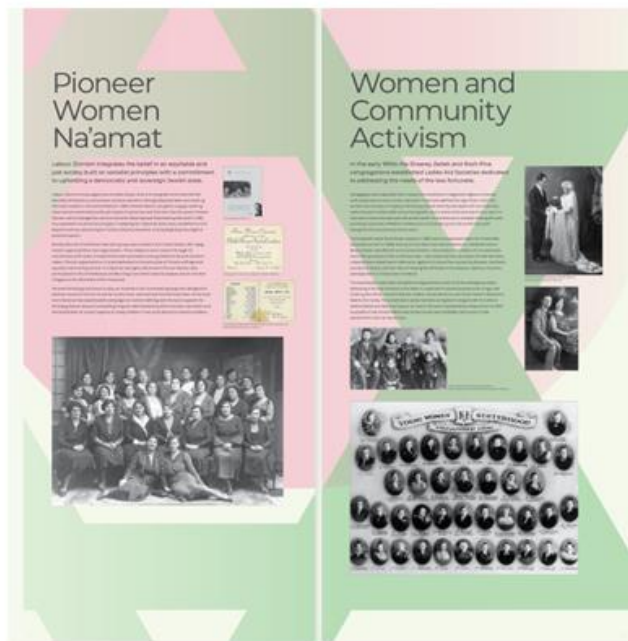
Chair, Daniel Stone **Director of Programs and Exhibits Stan Carbone**

The major focus of the Programs and Exhibits Committee was on researching and preparing an exhibit on "Jewish Communal Life and the Role of Women." The exhibit, which fills the entire window display area, examines the major but often overlooked contributions of Jewish women's organizations. Curator Stan Carbone and guest designer Aniko Szabo were able to install improved lighting in some of the cases. The Programs and Exhibits Committee also organized several programs, notably the 2024 Switzer-Cooperstock Prize Lecture by artist and historian Celia Rabinovitch on "The Lost Expressionist: Nick Yudell, a Photographer Rediscovered," examining the artistry of a young man Morden who died in combat during World War II. The program, "Kenora Keinahora. The Jews of the Lake of the Woods & The German POW Camps," with speakers Dr. Ray Singer and Braden Murray, Director of the Lake of the Woods Museum was particularly well attended. Unfortunately, there were no submissions for the 2025 Switzer-Cooperstock Student Prize but we continued our collaboration with the Gray Academy art program with an exhibit of student drawings based on historical photographs from the Heritage Centre archive. A Provincial Heritage Grant for research on Winnipeg Jewish artists by committee member Susan Freig was completed.

I would like to thank the members of the Programs and Exhibits Committee for their contributions and, especially, Director of Programs and Exhibits, Stan Carbone, for his work which touches on all aspects of the Heritage Centre. The teamwork of our staff, Stan, Executive Director Belle Jarniewski, and the archivists, Andrew Morrison and Ava Garfinkel contribute immeasurably to our achievements.
